Napa Valley's skies have changed. A growing number of deafening jets now fly low over the homes of **40,000 residents**, schools, hospitality areas and the agricultural land that defines this valley. This was done without public notice, public input or impact review. And there are plans to increase jet traffic, including large passenger operators like JSX.

We are a united community of Napa Valley neighbors working with officials to move the flight path back to equally safe, low-impact routes. We're not anti-airport. We are pro solutions. The FAA has responded most positively when residents, airport, and public officials – city, county and federal – pull together. We need you, too.

REPORT LOUD JETS



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- **HEALTH:** [100's of studies](#) including one [funded by the FAA](#) itself have proven that low jets over homes cause serious health injury including hypertension, stroke, heart attack & death – putting half the residents of Napa Valley in danger.
- **CHILDREN:** Loud jets fly directly over 4 Napa schools and nearly over 6 others as low as 1,200 feet. Many studies link aircraft exposure in children to poorer reading ability, lower test scores, and cognitive impairment. (NEMA Appendix B, Cornell.edu, others).
- **POLLUTION:** Each jet flying the new approach to Napa Airport emits 400 lbs. of pollutants on average including [toxic compounds](#) such as benzene formaldehyde, 1,3 butadiene, and many others (IopScience.org).
- **NO CURFEW:** Private and charter jets can land and take off 24/7 into Napa County Airport because the airport accepts subsidies from the FAA.
